QUICK FACTS

- Tourette's syndrome (TS) is a chronic neurobehavioral movement disorder that begins in childhood. Those affected make motor movements and vocalizations they cannot control. Additionally, many are plagued by Obsessive Compulsive Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, and/or learning disabilities.
- Between two and three percent of the U.S. population may have Tourette's syndrome. <u>In Texas, that translates to over one-half million people!</u>
- Approximately 90% of those served by TSA of Texas are children and their families. One in every 100 school-age boys and one in every three- to four-hundred school age girls may have T.S.
- Now in our 29th year, TSA of Texas strives to support the medical, educational, social and economic needs of those who suffer from Tourette's syndrome and to improve their quality of life.
- TSA of Texas NEVER charges for its services; dues or membership fees are not charged.
- The Tourette Syndrome Association provides its services throughout the entire state of Texas. While many cities have specific support group meetings, even those cities without a support group are eligible for services. Parents, adults, physicians and school districts throughout the entire state have requested and received Programs and Services as needed.

- Our 3 day camping weekend du Ballon Rouge, for Texas children and teens with Tourette's syndrome, is the only T.S. camp in the nation that has no charge to families totally staffed by volunteers and funded by donations and grants. Families travel from all over the state to have their children attend this free weekend.
- While Tourette's syndrome is not life-threatening per se, the stigma, misunderstanding and misdiagnosis of the disorder CAN devastate a child's life educationally, emotionally and socially.
- 100% of the money raised by TSA of Texas stays in Texas to provide Texans suffering from Tourette's syndrome and their families support, education, advocacy, social events, medical assistance and scholarships that can literally change the course of a person's life.
